

2024 NYTS: Youth Smoking Rate Hits 25 Year Low

Results from the 2024 National Youth Tobacco Survey (NYTS) show that the **youth smoking rate fell to 1.4% overall, the lowest rate in 25 years since the survey was first administered in 1999**. However, with 2.25 million youth still reporting current use of a tobacco product, youth tobacco use remains a serious public health problem in the United States.

BreakDown - 2024 Fall Sports Partnerships

The SNHD Tobacco Control Program's teen vaping prevention initiative, BreakDown, partnered with 70 local high school sports teams to promote vape-free lifestyles throughout the fall sports season. BreakDown provided educational training to promote vape-free lifestyles to 2,752+ teens and 70 coaches from August through October 2024.

Nevada State Health Equity Fair

The SNHD Tobacco Control Program shared educational materials with Nevada State University in November to support its adoption of a comprehensive tobacco-free policy. Information was also shared on the benefits of quitting smoking and referral information for the Nevada Tobacco Quitline.



Nevada Association of Student Councils Presidents Meeting

The SNHD Tobacco Control Program's youth vaping prevention initiative, BreakDown, established a partnership with the Nevada Association of Student Councils. Staff attended the Southern Nevada Student Council Presidents Meeting in November to promote vape-free lifestyles to high school students.

Greater tobacco retailer density has been linked with lower life expectancies and higher age-adjusted mortality rates.



The number of tobacco retailers per square mile is nearly 5x more in the lowest-income neighborhoods

than in the highest-income neighborhoods.

In lower-income neighborhoods, more tobacco retailers had advertisements for tobacco products, sold flavored cigars and cigarillos, and featured tobacco advertisements targeting youth.

Research has found higher tobacco retailer density in neighborhoods with a higher percentage of African Americans, as well as individuals living below the poverty line.

"\$76 Million in Illegal E-Cigarettes Seized in Joint Federal Operation"

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration, in collaboration with U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP), announced the administrative seizure of approximately three million units of unauthorized e-cigarette products, with an estimated retail value of \$76 million.
