The SNHD Tobacco Control Program's Hispanic/Latinx initiative, Por Mi Por Ti Por Nosotros, participated in the Christmas en el Barrio event to promote smoke-free lifestyles. This event took place on December 24th at CIVICA Academy in the East side of Vegas. The event had over 2,000 attendees and over 1,000 kids received free toys.

Secondhand smoke exposure during prenatal development

can cause pregnancy complications and poor birth outcomes, including impaired lung development, low birth weight, and preterm delivery.

Maternal smoking during pregnancy is **linked to double the risk** of sudden infant death and birth defects. In fact, maternal smoking is

the strongest risk factor leading to sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS).



Secondhand smoke exposure during childhood

increases the risk of respiratory infections, ear infections, meningitis, tooth decay, and asthma attacks.

Children exposed to tobacco smoke are more likely to experience behavioral issues and poor academic performance.

Tobacco smoke exposure in early life increases the likelihood of becoming a smoker later in life.

Children living with people who smoke are at an increased risk of dying before their fifth birthday.

"Denver City Council approves ban on sales of flavored tobacco products"

In December, the Denver City Council voted 11-1 to ban the sale of flavored tobacco products in the city. The ordinance includes bans on e-cigarettes, menthol cigarettes, vapes and other flavored nicotine and tobacco products.

National Birth Defects Prevention Month

National Birth Defects Prevention Month is a time to raise awareness about birth defects and highlight efforts to improve the health of people living with these conditions across their lifespan. Maternal smoking before or during pregnancy significantly increased the risk of birth defects.

The Southern Nevada Health District Tobacco Control Program works to prevent youth and young adult initiation, eliminate exposure to secondhand smoke, promote quitting and eliminate tobacco-related health disparities.



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
