My Life, My Quit Posters for Middle and High Schools

The SNHD Tobacco Control Program developed a series of educational posters promoting My Life, My Quit cessation resources for middle and high schools in Southern Nevada. These posters are available free of charge for educators via the Get Healthy Clark County website.

The SNHD Because We Matter African American initiative has partnered with the 23rd Annual Juneteenth Festival. Juneteenth (short for "June

Nineteenth") commemorates the effective end of slavery in the United States. This will be a festival of music, art, dance, rhythm, and culture. This event will offer food, live performances, and fun for the whole family.

Because We Matter will encourage tobacco-free lifestyles and promote available tobacco cessation resources at this signature community event. The festival will be held on Saturday, June 15th. This event is free and open to the public.

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BreakDown Athletic Partnerships

The SNHD Tobacco Control Program's **teen vaping prevention initiative, BreakDown, has partnered with 130+ local high school sports teams** to promote vape-free lifestyles throughout the 2023-2024 academic year. Through these partnerships, staff successfully provided vaping prevention training to 4,200+ student athletes this school year.

Fast Facts



TOBACCO USE IS THE LEADING CAUSE of preventable disease, disability, and death in the United States

and the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) community is especially at risk.





16.1% of lesbian, gay, and bisexual adults in Nevada use electronic vapor products, compared to 4.6% of straight adults.



Too often, LGBT safe spaces are polluted by tobacco smoke.

A 2011 assessment of bars and nightclubs in Las Vegas, Nevada found that patrons of LGBT venues had a

38% HIGHER CHANCE

of being exposed to secondhand smoke than patrons of non-LGBT venues.

14.2% of lesbian, gay, and bisexual middle and high school students currently use tobacco, compared to 7.9% of straight students nationwide.

18.9% of transgender middle and high school students currently use tobacco, compared to 8.2% of cisgender students nationwide.

26.0% of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and questioning high school students currently used electronic vapor products in 2019, compared to 21.6% of straight students In Nevada.

37.7% of transgender and questioning high school students currently used electronic vapor products in 2019, compared to 21.9% of cisgender students in Nevada.

Men's Health Month is observed in June to encourage healthy lifestyles among men. Smoking kills an estimated 278,544 men in the United States each year.
